TERMS AND CONDITIONS

I-bex is an online platform for hosting and conducting online behavioural experiments and surveys with the main aim to contribute to the scientific knowledge underpinning policy making within and outside of the European Commission. It collects data on the decisions and views of participants and may include interaction between two or more participants.

The platform is primarily depicted to be used by researchers (internal or external to the European Commission) to conduct experiments with voluntary participants. Participants will be recruited either by the researcher or by a recruitment company collaborating with the researcher. Both researchers and recruitment companies will be authorised to use the platform only if they are compatible with internal rules of the i-bex platform. Depending on the experimental design, participants may be entitled to receive lamp sum payments (for participating) or/and payments based on their own or others' decisions.

The European Union is the owner of the copyright and other intellectual and industrial property rights, trade secrets, and know-how related to the i-bex platform over which it has the power of disposal regardless geographical or other limitations. I-bex has been developed by the Joint Research Centre, the Foresight Modelling, Behavioural Insights and Design for Policy Unit (I.2) of the European Commission and is managed by the Competence Centre on Behavioural Insights (hereinafter "the **CCBI**"). The CCBI is responsible for the ethical integrity and the implementation of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 concerning data privacy.

I-bex is widely accessible for all European Union citizens and provides support for anonymity.

I. Applicable terms

Access to, and use of, any part of the I-bex platform (hereinafter "**the Platform**"), any document, material or other information, including data, text, images, sound and video (hereinafter "**Information**") made available on the website and any of the informatics tools provided as services via the website (hereinafter "**Tools**") are governed by these terms and conditions of use (hereinafter "**Terms and Conditions**") and constitute acceptance of these Terms and Conditions by the User.

BY USING THE PLATFORM, YOU (HEREINAFTER "THE USER") AGREE TO BE BOUND TO THESE TERMS AND CONDITIONS. IF YOU DO NOT AGREE TO ANY OF THE TERMS OR CONDITIONS PROVIDED HEREIN, PLEASE DO NOT USE THE PLATFORM OR ANY INFORMATION OR TOOLS HEREIN.

Specific terms and conditions may apply to specific parts of the Platform as indicated for those concerned parts. Where provided, specific terms shall supersede any differing provision of the Terms and Conditions in respect to those services or parts.

The European Commission reserves the right to amend these Terms and Conditions and any other specific terms on the Platform at any time by posting amended terms and conditions on the website. Such amendments will take effect on the date on which they are posted.

III. Rights and limitations

III.1. General provisions for all categories of Users

Subject to the Terms and Conditions provided herein, access to Platform is granted to the User on a non-exclusive, non-transferrable and royalty-free basis within the scope and objectives pursued by the Platform and in accordance with any applicable law thereto.

The User may not use the Platform in a manner which may mislead or confuse people into believing that any products and services provided by the User are in some way endorsed or certified by the European Union. Under no circumstance shall the User use the European Commission logo or otherwise spend the official name and credentials of the European Commission to imply affiliation, endorsement or other official link to European Commission unless explicitly permitted under the European Commission's visual identity policy (<u>https://ec.europa.eu/info/resources-partners/european-commission-visual-identity_en</u>).

III.2. Special provisions for specific categories of Users

Special provisions apply to specific categories of Users such as researchers or participants. Notwithstanding anything under this section, the general provisions shall apply correspondingly.

All Users need to own (or create) an ECAS account in order to use the Platform.

Researchers

In order to use the Platform, researchers need to be firstly authorised by CCBI on the basis of background information provided in the Platform during the registration stage. Authorisation is also granted through the Platform. Researchers creating an experiment, uploading materials or otherwise making Information available through the Platform are entirely responsible for the content of, and any harm resulting from, that content (hereinafter "**Content**"). That is the case regardless of whether the Content in question constitutes text, graphics, an audio file, computer software or any other format.

By making Content available, the researcher represents and warrants that:

- The downloading, copying and use of the Content will not infringe the proprietary rights, including but not limited to the copyright, patent, trademark or trade secret rights, of any third party;
- If researcher's employer has rights to intellectual property create by the researcher, the researcher has either (i) received permission from his/her employer to post or make available the Content, including but not limited to any software, or (ii) secured from his/her employer a waiver as to all rights in or to the Content;
- The researcher has fully complied with any third-party licenses relating to the Content and have done all things necessary to successfully pass through to participants or any Users any required terms;
- The Content does not contain or install any viruses, worms, malware, trojan horses or other harmful or destructive content;
- The Content is not used for political activism or propaganda.
- The Content is not spam, is not machine or randomly-generated, and does not contain unethical or unwanted commercial content designed to drive traffic to third party sites or boost the search engine rankings of third party sites, or to further unlawful acts (such as phishing) or mislead recipients as to the source of the material (such as spoofing);
- The Content is not pornographic, does not contain threats or incite violence, and does not violate the privacy or publicity rights of any third party;
- The experiment is not getting advertised via unwanted electronic messages such as spam links on newsgroups, email lists, other blogs and web sites, and similar unsolicited promotional methods;
- The experiment is not named in a manner that misleads readers into thinking that the researcher is another person or company.
- If the experiment includes experimental payments to participants, the researcher is responsible for the realisation of the payments.

By submitting Content to the Platform for inclusion in researchers' experiment, the researcher grants CCBI a world-wide, royalty-free, and non-exclusive license to reproduce, modify, adapt and publish the Content solely for the purpose of displaying, distributing and promoting researchers' experiment. If the researcher deletes the Content, CCBI will use reasonable efforts to remove it from the application, but the researcher will be acknowledged that caching or references to the Content may not be made immediately removed.

Without limiting any of those representations or warranties, CCBI has the right (though not the obligation) to, in CCBI's sole discretion (i) refuse or remove any content that, in CCBI's opinion, violates any official policy or is in any way harmful or objectionable, or (ii) terminate or deny access to and use of the application to any individual or entity for any reason.

For the purpose of their experiments, researchers can collaborate with recruitment companies. In order to use the Platform, recruitment companies need to be firstly authorised by CCBI on the basis of background information provided in the Platform during the registration stage. Authorisation is also granted through the Platform . Researchers are entirely responsible that (i) the recruitment companies respect the Content of the experiment and (ii) experimental payments to participants (if any, according to the Content) are realised according to the payment rules described in the Content. CCBI will only have a supervising role (but not responsibility) in the collaboration agreement between the two parties and in the payment process (realised either by the Researcher or by the Recruitment company) solely for protecting the reputation of the Platform.

Experimental Participants

Experimental participants (or participants) are recruited either by the researchers or by a recruitment company collaborating with the researchers. Participants are obliged to create an ECAS account before starting the experiment. Participants should act responsibly with the Information provided in the experiment and within the rules of the experiment as communicated on an individual basis. They are entirely responsible for the Information provided, and any harm resulting from that Information. CCBI has not reviewed and cannot review, all of the material posted to the

different experiments, and cannot, therefore, be responsible for that material's content, use or effects. By operating the application, CCBI does not represent or imply that it endorses the material there created, or that it believes such material to be accurate, useful or non-harmful. Participants are responsible for taking precautions as necessary to protect themselves and their computer systems from viruses, worms, trojan horses, and other harmful or destructive content.

CCBI disclaims any responsibility for any harm resulting from the use by Users of the Platform or from any downloading by those persons of content there available.

IV. Acknowledgement
